

H1N1 Influenza vaccine

Initial supplies of H1N1 flu vaccine are limited. Our country has recommended that people with higher risk of medical complications from H1N1 flu receive the vaccine before others. The vaccine may cause side effects such as puffiness, fever, serious symptoms. If you want to receive the vaccine, please understand the risks, and then decide for yourself.

About H1N1 flu

Most people have only a mild case of H1N1 flu, and the flu drug Tamiflu and Relenza are effective against H1N1 flu. But people who have basic diseases, pregnant women and children may become seriously ill.

What are basic diseases?

The following diseases are basic diseases. If you have questions about whether you should receive the vaccine, consult your primary care doctor.

Chronic respiratory illness, Chronic cardiac disease, Chronic kidney disease, Chronic liver disease, Neurological disease, Neuromuscular disease, Blood disease, Diabetes, Immunocompromised condition by diseases or treatments, Pediatric chronic disease

Vaccination schedule and necessary papers

You must make an appointment with a medical institution to receive the vaccine. Don't make appointments with many medical institutions.
